Meet Coordinator's Report

PROVINCIALS

Who could have guessed it! Our provincial championship was destined to be DQ'd once again, this time by a strike of the Toronto city inside workers' union. Meet manager Tony Aitchison and his team at EOMAC deserve our thanks for a super organization and their great efforts to keep us all well informed, but they were forced to cancel just 3 or 4 days before the meet.

Of course no such problems are foreseen for next year. The Ontario Swim Officials' Association is currently seeking sanction to hold the 2001 Ontario Masters Swimming Championships at the Etobicoke Olympium on March 30,31, and April 1, 2001. I'm sure we all wish OSOA President John Grootveld the best of luck with our much-delayed championships, the first since 1998.

The 2001 meet is the first of a 3-year commitment by the Olympium to reserve a weekend in March/April for our championship meet, with the actual dates to be confirmed in June of the previous year. I am now accepting bids from interested clubs of combination of clubs to host the 2002 and 2003 championship meets. If some other suitable venue is preferred by a prospective host club, this would need to be confirmed in time to cancel our commitment with the Olympium, ie- by June1, 2001 or 2002.

OTHER MEETS

There was a number of interesting developments during the regular meet schedule this year. While we lost three establish meets (Rideau-Speedeaus, Brantford and McMaster U.), there were some encouraging results of the cancelled Provincials, as Clarington, Pickering and SOO Masters clubs offered small local meets as part of larger age-group meets. This trend to joint meets may gain in popularity in the future as small Masters clubs look for more local competition opportunities for their members. Other meets were all successful as usual, with two meets a year at some clubs (Burlington, 1000 Islands, Alderwood) an unexpected pleasure. The full offering of meets all season by Technosport continues to be well received in the Ottawa area.

As meet coordinator I would like to see more long course meets offered during the year. Without McMaster this year we had only London and Nepean which are often just one week apart. This doesn't help Ontario swimmers in the National LC rankings each year! (How about it... Uof T and Brock Masters?) EOMAC is planning one in 2001, and maybe we'll get back to McMaster too.

Another overlooked opportunity for local competition is the club-based time trial. These require far less organization and expense than a regular invitational meet, and they permit a club to emphasize their favourite events or relays locally and still have their times count for records and top 10/20 listings provincially and nationally...AND a time trial can be run within the regular team workout of 1-2 hours.

MEET BUSINESS

New revised forms were produced this year for meet sanction application, sanction confirmation, and the now-compulsory meet report form. Meet managers and others involved in meet planning are asked to destroy their old versions of these forms. Our Webster does post the new ones. Three key changes include the need for confirmation of the presiding chief official at the meet, the inclusion of the completed meet package with the application before sanction will be granted, and revised safety rules that outline an officially supervised warm-up designed to prevent accidents.

Best wishes to all for Masterful performances next year!

MSC Report

It has been a very busy year for Masters Swimming Canada. Nationals 2000 were held in Halifax in May. The number of swimmers wishing to attend far exceeded the limit of 450 and there were many unhappy swimmers, some who actually arrived to swim and found that they were not registered and were unable to compete. In the open meeting held during the swim meet there were many excellent suggestions made as how to avoid these problems from reoccurring in the future. From all reports the swimming was excellent and the hospitality outstanding especially for lobster lovers. Note that the 2001 Nationals will be held in Calgary May 18-21 and there will be NO entry limit, but make sure you get your entries in before the deadline!

The MSO idea of representation on Provincial Boards and the Swimming Officials Boards has been started by MSC. The purpose is to foster good relationships, share information across the country, assist the Rules Committee in their endeavours to update the rule book and to provide the best environment for swimmers to reach their goals. At the moment we have BC, NB and ONT on board and hope to gain reps from the other Provinces. Ontario is functioning well with the reps on both Boards. (Swim Ontario and Ontario Swimming Officials Association)

MSC will be producing a new rule book in 2001. The MSO Rules Committee will have input to the MSC Rules Committee and will hopefully be able to incorporate changes in the MSO Handbook due to be updated next year

Marketing Report

There were four initiatives undertaken by the Marketing Group

1. To increase the number of Registered Masters Clubs

All existing club locations were identified. Where there was not a present letters were sent to the Town/City and/or the "Y". In total 24 letters were sent in early summer. To date the Registrar has heard from three groups wishing to establish new clubs.

2. Recognition of Masters Swimmers by their Municipal officials.

A letter (see attached) was sent to Mayor Lastman, City of Toronto in September. This initiative could be undertaken in any location. Should a club wish the Board to write on their behalf we would be more than willing to undertake this initiative in your community.

3. To increase participation by swimmers in meets:

The introduction the Ontario Masters Swimming Participation Award for the year 2001. Proposal approved by the Board and to be discussed at the AGM.

4. To increase participation by swimmers at meets and foster team spirit

Efforts are underway to explore a "Meet Series" with meet managers in the Western, Huronia/Central, Golden Horseshoe, Toronto-Downtown and Toronto-Metro Regions. It is hoped that with the meet managers support the Marketing Committee will be able to attract corporate sponsors for participants. It is hoped that feedback will be received prior to the AGM

5. To utilize the existing liaison with Swim Ontario to advance Masters swimming throughout Ontario

Discussions are presently underway with Swim Ontario on several other issues. It is hoped that we will be able to discuss in the future such items as combined meets and practices where applicable

Statistics Report

2000 has been a very good year

Results have been received from 30 Ontario-sanctioned or International meets. These results are now all on the MSO web site.

Results have come in from Alderwood, London (Ont), Ottawa (Technosport), Winnipeg, Nepean, Etobicoke, Brockville, Burlington, Milton, Ste Foy, Buffalo, Ancaster, Clarington, Pickering, Sault Ste Marie, Halifax, Indianapolis, Buffalo, Baltimore, Holland (Michigan), Columbus (Ohio) and from Munich. The swimmers in the meet in Munich, are particularly to be congratulated since they created 19 new Ontario Long Course Records. Altogether, 195 new Ontario records have been set this year.

Of our total membership approximately one-third are active competitors - 329 women and 400 men have recorded their results for the first year of the new century. The number of swims per swimmer is 7.66 and the average number of meets per year per swimmer is 1.81. This augers well for our future. If each swimmer would take part in 14 different swims during the year we would have a very creditable number of members operating at the "bronze" level of achievement under the new proposed participation plan.

Another encouraging factor has been the report from results of combined age-group/master meets (such as the meet in Clarington). Not only are the masters galvanized by the young competition, but the kids realize that life can BEGIN at 20 and can continue well past the biblical three score years and ten, handicaps and health problems notwithstanding.

Please remember that we can only process results we RECEIVE and that results must be from sanctioned meets either in Ontario or elsewhere. To qualify for inclusion in Ontario results/records you must be swimming for an ONTARIO club.

Lesley and I do not download results from the internet and we often unaware of the many meets attended by Ontario swimmers out of the Province/Country.

If your record is also a Canadian Record, the applications are processed for Ontario Records and then sent to Christian Berger, the National Recorder

REPORT FROM THE OFFICIALS AND RULES CHAIRPERSON

OFFICIALS

The past year has been a very busy one for Master Swimmers with 26 meets held in Ontario from September 1998 to September 1999 including the Canadian National Championship held in Nepean. When you consider that it takes seven major officials plus a minimum of two timers per lane of the pool plus the behind the scenes people and the people involved in the meet management before and after the meet it becomes apparent that we are lucky to have these knowledgeable people helping us. Most of our senior officials are Swim Ontario Officials who give up their weekends to enable us to swim. The next time you attend a swim meet please remember to say thank you. I noticed that there are usually swimmers helping at meets. This was quite apparent at Nationals when swimmers were helping during the periods when they were not swimming, the Meet Management appreciated your help.

With 22 meets already on the calendar for the 1999-2000 swim season it will continue to be important to help staff these meets. Contact your local age group swim club to find out when they are holding clinics and get certified. I strongly recommend allswimmers take a stroke and turn clinic, it will really help your swimming. There are many jobs to be done for a swim meet so offer to help your club when they are hosting a meet and also offer your services when you are at a meet, you will certainly be appreciated.

RULES

All swimmers received their new hand book this year. We owe Michael Stroud and his committee a great vote of thanks for producing this very helpfull book. It took many hours of many days to update the rules portion of the book. Michael and his committee feel the rules are clear and easy to understand. The rules will be updated as need be during the period between hand books. The only change at present does not affect Masters as we in Canada already do it, is that it is recommended that swim meets use the one start rule (FINA) for all meets as that will be the starting procedure of the upcoming Olympics

'PROVINCIALS' REPORT - C. Lane

(part of the package of Directors' reports at the Masters Swimming Ontario AGM on Dec12,1999)

Last December I offered myself to the Board as a single-issue Director to try and establish an effective process that would make sure we had a provincial championship meet every year for ever and ever. It's now 9 months later as I write this and I am finally close to confirming our beloved Provincials for the coming year, with some good news and a real challenge for the future.

As you read this in December 99 you already have the news about when and where the 2000 Provincials will take place. Yet my own frustration and impatience at such slow progress over an entire year will not even be apparent as well all excitedly prepare for the big meet. But believe me when I say we came close to missing out again this year. That would be 2 years in a row and 4 of the last 10 years without an Ontario Masters Championship!

The problems are almost always variations of these two imponderables...prime time pool space in March or April in one of our very few large centres, and the labour required to mount any big meet. I spent the winter months seeking out the advice and experience of Masters organizers in other provinces. Their answers were different in the details, but the same overall assessment : Masters usually come last at the trough when pool time is being handed out, but once you have the venue assured it's all up to that small group of determined people that make any major event happen.

Some provinces even have a roster of clubs waiting their turn to host Provincials...imagine! Only Ontario has so many members to deal with...2,400+ now, that's almost half of Canada's total! Some have more corporate or commercial sponsorship to rely on each year, and others have a system of rotating the host club to cover the largest regions of population, as we used to do in Ontario...from Nepean to Waterloo to Pickering to Etobicoke to Thunder Bay in the mid-80's. But since 1990 only once (1997-Brantford) did any pool except Nepean and Etobicoke host Provincials. EOMAC and MBLA each ran the meet twice at the Olympium.

The trend seems to be a gravitation toward the big centres like Nepean and Etobicoke (and of course Nepean also hosted the great Nationals meet this year). Thus the burden of running the meet, or of justifying why they don't wish to do so year after year, tends to fall unfairly on the home club. Because I swim for EOMAC and have acted as their meet manager during these past 2 turbulent years, I am very aware of the residual effects on a club's spirits when they are called upon too often to host The Big One. If it takes a year to plan for Provincials, then it takes at least 2 more years for a club to get over it. Remember that our friends at North York Master Blasters have demonstrated in 93 and again in 96 that a club not based at the Olympium can run very successful and profitable meets there, once the venue has been safely booked well in advance.

So here's the deal...the good news and the challenge...**I have secured a confirmed reservation for one week-end in April at the Etobicoke Olympium for the next 3 years for Masters provincial championships.** Thus it is with renewed optimism and great faith in our Masters friends out there that I ask our clubs to step forward...either individually or in combinations of 2 or more clubs willing to share the duties... with your offers to run Provincials in **2001, 2000, or 2003**. You are assured that the pool time has

already been pre-booked for a prime week-end in April, with the exact dates to be scheduled a year ahead.

We now have a great pool at a great time for the next 3 years. Which year would your club like to host? All it takes is a year of hard work, and in return you get (almost) guaranteed profits and everyone's heartfelt gratitude... Let me know.
